#### WELFARE BENEFICIARY NEWS - Silvereen Jacotine – Welfare Beneficiary Coordinator



The Welfare Beneficiary scheme has shown an increase in the number of applicants requesting aid and presently 15 applicants have been shortlisted for consideration. To ensure that the most deserving applicants are placed on as WB's, the club has new application forms, requiring more detailed information. These applicants are initially interviewed by the DBU Welfare Committee and their recommendations forwarded to us.



These recommendations are then discussed on a case by case basis by the Eighty Club Committee, prioritizing the applicant's needs.

Final acceptance of the applicant is confirmed subsequent to the DBU visiting the applicant at their homes.

Even though this process can take time, it is essential that all are members and well-wishers are aware that we need to ensure that the most deserving applicants are added on as WB's and also that we need to confirm the 'bona fides' of every application we receive.




The cost of living has been spiraling upwards and the club is always considering as to how we can increase the payments to the WB's. It has been a considerable time since we have been able to increase the base payments of Rs3000 per month for a single applicant and allow for increases to both the spouse allowances and family allowances, where applicable. Unfortunately, to increase funding to our WB's is no easy decision as firstly we have to be prudent in our commitments and carefully consider our fund raising capabilities. Also considering the number of applications received, we believe that it is important to help as many as possible. As always with our elderly WB's, it is the cost of medication, so necessary

at their age, that is prohibitive. It is the most heartbreaking experience to read through the many applications, recognize their plight and have to decide who is the most deserving.

This year once again, thanks to your donations and improved numbers at our fund-raisers, we were able to pay a mid-year bonus of Rs4000/= to all our WB's, an increase of Rs1000/= from the previous year.

Hopefully this December we will be able to increase our Christmas bonus too.



Life is getting harder for more and more people and we depend on your generosity and that of your relatives / friends to help us. There are many ways you can help by increasing membership, speaking about the work we do and convincing people to join in this journey, to help bring relief to so many who look to us for help.

As with most terrorist attacks it is the innocent who suffer the most. The bomb blast that rocked the Protestant Zion Church in Batticaloa, claimed the life of the mother of young Sheshan Ragell. This tragedy, in the life of this young boy, sponsored through the Eighty Club Melbourne, is catastrophic as the mother was the sole bread winner for the family. The father who suffers from a serious heart condition has been unable to work and fend for the family. Immediate assistance was given to the family by the club and a sum of Rs10,000/= handed over to the father. At present consideration is being given to assist the family by placing the father Edman Ragell as a welfare beneficiary.

# The VOC Heritage in Asia

# Dutch Burghers of Ceylon - Exhibition



Under the patronage of Ms. Nina van Dorth, a two part exhibition on the VOC Heritage in Asia and also The Dutch Burghers of Ceylon was held at the Burgher Association Australia, Community Hall, with the opening ceremony on the  $8^{th}$  June, 2019. The exhibition, featured

the social interaction in the VOC settlements in Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) and the historical section highlighted the social life of the 17th-18th century Dutch Maritime occupation in Ceylon. The Company rules and regulations, moulded the social interaction of the Dutch (European) community with the indigenous population.





The Ceylon Dutch Burghers are an ethnic group of mixed raced descendants of ancestors who were in service or otherwise linked to the Verenigde Oost-Indische Compagnie (VOC). With the Dutch capitulation in 1796, and in the years that followed, the Dutch and Portuguese communities accepted British sovereignty and were referred to by the new regime by the 1830's as a mixed-race community who were to be known as the 'Ceylon Burghers'.

Guest speaker at the opening ceremony was the former Governor of Victoria, Professor David de Kretser accompanied by his wife Jan.

Representing the Eighty Club Melbourne was our Vice President Trevor Collette together with Jill.

Such a cold hearted and callous attack on the holiest day of the Christian calendar will remain etched in our memories. People in the sanctity of a place of worship, celebrating a day for rejoicing, praying with their families and others on holiday sitting down for breakfast, never imagining the horror that would take place.

There has been inquiries as to how we can help those affected and just as the club gave aid to the Tsunami victims in 2004, so too should we help the victims and survivors of this tragedy. As always our priority is for the victims. The children left orphaned and those with injuries that will take many years to heal. Our aim is not to rebuild the bricks and mortar

that has been destroyed, but to rebuild the lives of many, who may not and probably never will get the assistance to rebuild their shattered lives.

With the passage of time, there will be many who will come to our attention needing help and it is only with your generosity

that we will be able to see to their needs.
