STUDENT SPONSORSHIP NEWS - Trevor Collette

120 students in Colombo currently receive assistance. 11 are studying at "A" level.

39 students in Batticaloa receive sponsorship. 6 students are at "A" level and 6 are in University.

Each "A" level student receives Rs. 15,000 a quarter and the other students receive Rs. 12,000 a quarter. These allowances are paid by individual sponsors.

10 students are in the PSET Scheme. They are all studying in tertiary institutes and provide quarterly reports on their progress. The PSET payments are made from ECM funds in the scheme established by the late Mr. Ivor de Kretser. The PSET allowance is Rs. 20,000 per student.

The student numbers have decreased from 189 at the end of 2022 to 159 at present.

Though we are able to get more deserving applicants from both Colombo and Batticaloa we need to increase the number of sponsors to take on the new students. Most of the "older" sponsors are not willing to take on a new sponsorship as they are now in different circumstances (physically and /or financially).

I appeal to our members to take on a sponsorship if you currently do not have one. Do encourage friends and relatives to support the educational needs of a poor student, by contributing as a student sponsor.

Lives Shattered – A True Life Story of a Family's Struggle with Tragedy and Loss

The family of five were happy and content. The father was doing a business of buying and selling clothes and the mother helped him while taking care of the 3 young school going children. They didn't live a luxurious life but were happy always hoping for a better tomorrow.

Then tragedy struck. The young father was run over by a lorry while returning home and died on the spot! The young mother was devastated not knowing how to cope with the situation and how to find the money for their day to day expenses. All three children were attending international schools where the school fees were high but the parents wanted the best for their children and an education in the English language. Even the house they occupied was on rent.

She was desperate. Then someone told her about the DBU and she visited us. She was given the Child Sponsorship applications as well as a WB application for herself. These applications were sent to the **Eighty Club Melbourne** and all three children were sponsored. Their sponsor, obviously a very caring person, would send them gifts on a regular basis and this helped the family to get through the difficult times. The Mother was also sponsored by the ECM as a WB. She also opened a small shop outside her house and with the little money she earned and with the help she received from the Club and her husband's family, she brought up these three children. The Landlord was a kind person and permitted them to continue to stay in the same house.



The mother, Champika, and her eldest daughter, Aimy followed a Professional course in Health-care (clinical caregiver), CPR & AED training at the Red Cross Society, Rehabilitation in Elderly care, first Aid and on the job training at the King's Hospital with the hope of obtaining a job in Australia. Unfortunately the relative who had promised to help them passed away suddenly and all their hopes were dashed. Today the eldest daughter is working at the DBU,Colombo, the second boy is following a Hotel Course and the youngest is still going to school. Sadly, Champika the mother has been diagnosed with cancer and will be going for chemotherapy shortly. She is worried and sad and praying that things will go well and she will be blessed with a new lease of life and we share that same hope. Only time will tell.

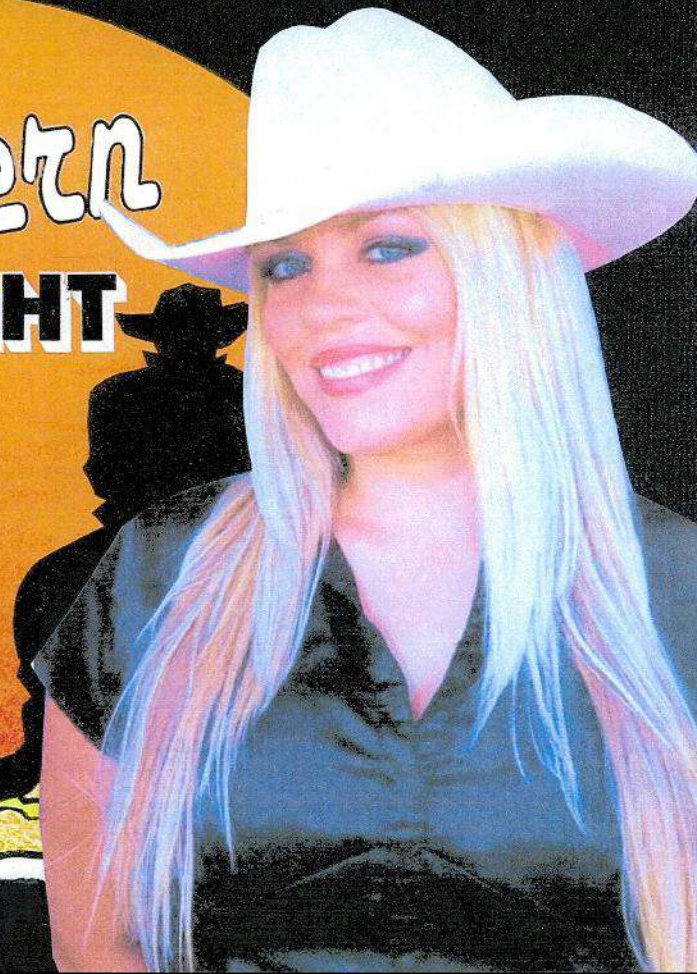
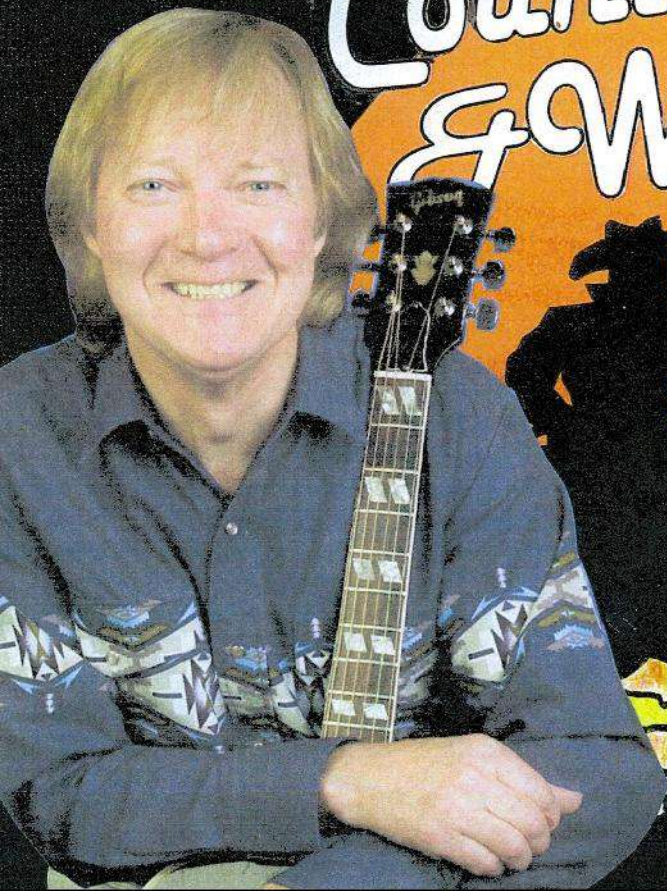

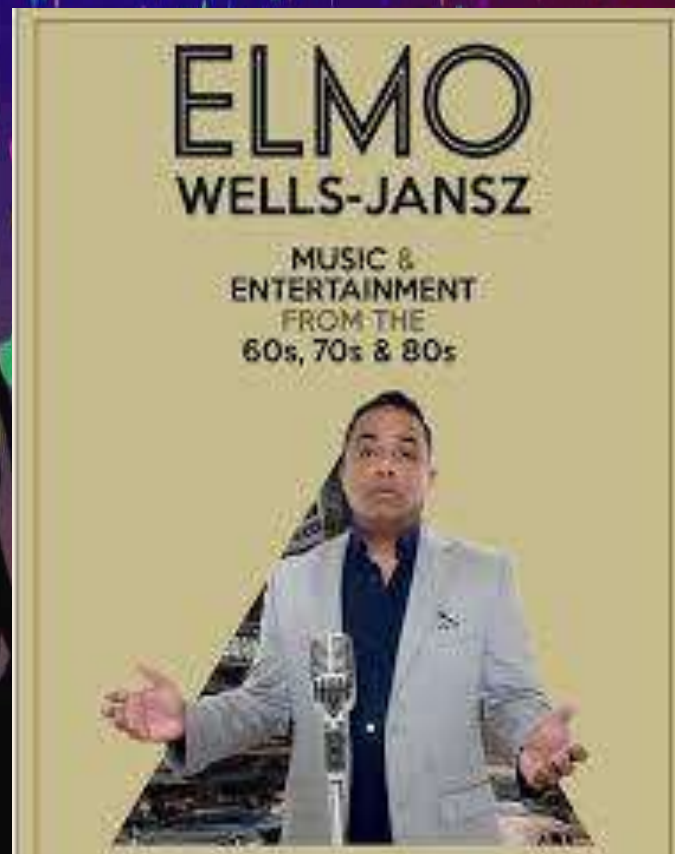
